Later in the conversation [redacted] stated that it was the interrogators he wanted to specifically single out as violators of any regulations regarding the Koran. For this, he stated, he had a specific message which he wished to pass to all interrogators.

The use of the Koran as a weapon against detainees, [redacted] stated, had failed. Interrogators who had taken the Koran from individual detainees as a reprisal or as an incentive for cooperation had failed to sway the brothers and would continue to fail. The only thing which would result from these actions, [redacted] stated, would be the damage caused to the reputation of the United States once what had occurred was released to the world.

He had heard that the man may have attempted suicide, but did not believe that to be the case since all Muslims knew that those who committed suicide would be immediately sent to hell.

[redacted] stated that he and others believed that it was more likely that the brother had been killed fighting over the Koran. According to [redacted], a box of Korans that were stacked in the corner of their block had fallen over. A Koran in one of the boxes had fallen out. The detainees thought that it was more likely that the brother had attempted to fight for the Koran and had then been killed.

But he described guards throwing the book down on the floor. He was told this was not the way all Americans acted, that many respect Islam, but he said he was convinced all Americans are that way.

Asked whether or not he thought the September 11 attacks against the Twin Towers were justified, he said his religion is against suicide attacks or killing innocent people.

He agreed to look at photographs at another time and identify anyone he knows in the photos.
